### Stats: National Center for Missing and Exploited Children ("NCMEC") Tip Line

Reports Made Between Jan. 1 - June 30	2024	2025
Online Enticement	292,951	518,720
Sadistic Online Enticement	508	1,093
Financial Sextortion	13,842	23,593
Generative Artificial Intelligence	6,835	440,419
Child Sex Trafficking	5,976	62,891

### **Stats: NCMEC Tip Line**

Reports of online enticement

increased by more than 300%

from 44,155 in 2021 to 186,819 in 2023.

In 2023, reports made to the CyberTipline rose more than 12% from the previous year, surpassing 36.2 million

reports.

# 2. Commonly Charged Crimes

### Production of Child Pornography 18 U.S.C. § 2251(a)

- 15-year man./min., 30-year max.
- Must prove three things:
  - 1. Defendant enticed, coerced, etc. minor to engage in sexually explicit conduct.
  - 2. Defendant acted with purpose of producing a visual depiction of such conduct.
  - 3. Visual depiction transported using any means or facility of interstate or foreign commerce.
- Typically internet-based activity

### Enticing a Minor to Engage in Sexual Activity 18 U.S.C. § 2422(b)

- 10-year man./min., Life max.
- Must prove four things:
  - 1. Defendant knowingly enticed, coerced, etc. an individual to engage in sexually explicit conduct.
  - 2. Defendant used any facility or means of interstate or foreign commerce to do so.
  - 3. Defendant believed target to be a minor.
  - 4. Had the sexual activity occurred, the Defendant could be charged with a criminal offense

### Sex Trafficking 18 U.S.C. § 1591

- 15-year man./min., Life max.
- Must prove three things:
  - Defendant knowingly recruited, enticed, solicited by any means a minor.
  - 2. The defendant committed the act knowing or in reckless disregard of the fact that force, fraud, coercion ect. were be used to cause the minor to engage in a commercial sex act. And
  - 3. The defendant used a cell phone or the internet

## Receiving, Transporting, Distributing Child Pornography 18 U.S.C. § 2252A(a)(1) and (2)

- Five-year man./min., 20-year max.
- Must prove two things:
  - 1. Defendant knowingly received, transported, or distributed child pornography by means of a facility of interstate commerce.
  - 2. Defendant knew materials were child pornography.

### Possessing Child Pornography 18 U.S.C. § 2252A(a)(5)

- No man./min., 10-year max.
- Must prove three things:
  - 1. Defendant knowingly possessed or accessed with the intent to view child pornography.
  - 2. The pornography was mailed, shipped, or transported using any facility of interstate or foreign commerce.
  - 3. When the Defendant possessed or accessed the material, he or she knew it was child pornography.
- Max. increases to 20 years for prepubescent.

### **Definition of "Child Pornography"**

- 18 U.S.C. § 2256(8)
- "Child pornography" covers "any visual depiction, including any photograph, film, video, picture, or computer or computer-generated image or picture"
- Image must be one of the following:
  - Depicts minor engaging in sexually explicit conduct;
  - Digital image actually depicts "or is indistinguishable from" a minor engaging in sexually explicit conduct; or
  - Digital image was created or modified to appear that an identifiable minor is engaging in sexually explicit conduct.

### **Attempted v. Completed Crime**

- For Child Exploitation, Penalties Generally the Same
- Important Prevention Tool
- Knowledge is Key
- Substantial Step
- Typical Use Cases:
  - Undercover Operation
  - Unidentified Minor
  - Incomplete Enticement Offense


# 3. Five Emergent Prosecution Challenges



 Adds Complex Dynamic to Victim Experience









United States of America v. Marco Pagano, No. 24-CR-20360-ALTMAN (S.D. Fla. 2024)

### Background

- Snapchat
- Infiltrated a group of girls at a UK high school
- Word got around school
- February 2024, teacher heard about it, intervened and called law enforcement
- UK law enforcement interview minors

### Investigation

- Four Snapchat Accounts: @marcopio35, @markstuffpam, @marcopio3366, @marcopio2024
- Search Warrant to Snap, Inc.
- Subpoena to PayPal



Attempted Coercion and Enticement of a Minor to Engage in Sexual Activity

Title 18, United States Code, Section 2422(b)

- \* Max. Term of Imprisonment: Life
- \* Mandatory Min. Term of Imprisonment (if applicable): 10 years
- \* Max. Supervised Release: 5 years to life
- \* Max. Fine: \$250,000

Count #: 2

Attempted Production of Child Pornography

Title 18, United States Code, Section 2251(a) and (e)

- \* Max. Term of Imprisonment: 30 years
- \* Mandatory Min. Term of Imprisonment (if applicable): 15 years
- \* Max. Supervised Release: 5 years to life
- \* Max. Fine: \$250,000






